responses to our Neighbourhood Plan
questionnaire. This is a high percentage
of the 1600 houses in the village.

We are grateful that so many in the village took the time to let us know their views and thoughts; these will help the development of our Neighbourhood Plan. 10 Things You Should Know About the Village

s part of the Government's Neighbourhood Planning initiative that the Parish Council is signed up for we wrote and circulated a questionnaire to over 90% of homes and received a massive 670 responses.

We will be analysing these, with the help of other volunteers, to arrive at a format for a referendum later in the year, but in the meantime it's clear we haven't been as forthcoming as we should have about some issues the Council is responsible for. Councillor Martyn Colvey

has looked through all the comments to find the things you should already know, because we should have told you! In the main you've given opinions because that's what we asked for and there is no intention to argue for or against those in this. We simply want to respond to stuff you should already know about your village. As a parallel project we are revamping the village / Parish Council website and in the future you will be able to find more answers to your questions there. So, what were the misapprehensions? (see below). Cllr Martyn Colvey

Questionnaire Comments and Answers

1). **Comment:** How much longer is the site in Huntick Road going to be discussed?

Answer: Extra houses allocated here as part of the total for Purbeck was a condition demanded by the Inspector when approving Purbeck's Local Plan up to the year 2027. We have just heard that the owner has appointed an agent to sell the land. Morrish Builders, who developed the Foxhills estate, and local builder Fry have expressed an interest.

2). Comment: Not enough space in (LM Primary) school, so no more housing should be built.

Answer: This came up in different forms under several headings. The County is responsible for this school and funding is 'per head' so, if there are more pupils the County will provide more facilities to match.

3). Comment: No industry at all, simply an overspill.

Answer: Here's a fact. When approval was given for Freeland Park, opposite the Methodist Church, the planners required 82 spaces for cars. So, how many additional jobs are catered for there?

4). Comment: The school is full and so is the doctor's surgery. **Answer:** See above for the school and the doctors are also funded on a 'per head' basis. It's up to them to set the size of their surgery. Perhaps we'll ask them for a comment in a later edition of Link!

5).Comment: Village is sprawling, Greenbelt should be

Answer: The Greenbelt is well-preserved and its purpose is to stop us merging with surrounding towns like Poole and

Corfe Mullen. It does this by being several kilometres deep and shaving off a few metres in Huntick Road does not defeat that purpose.

6. Comment: On no account should any part of the Recreation Ground be developed.

Answer: The parish Council has just spent over 2 years getting the Recreation Ground designated as a Field In Trust this will preserve it in perpetuity. You will soon see signs erected to indicate this.

7). Comment: Traffic in the village drives too fast anyway. **Answer:** A group of villagers are being trained by the police to use hand-held 'speed detectors'. If you would like to join this group send me your contact details and I will pass them on. martyn@colvey.tv

8). Comment: PDC tend to put problem families from Swanage into Lytchett.

Answer: We'll ask PDC to comment on this in a later edition of the Link.

9). Comment: Proper Parish Council Offices

Answer: The PC has been in serious talks for the past 2 years. with the Scouts to do a 'premises swap' They would get a much larger building behind the Army Cadet HQ and the PC would take on their current building in the car park opposite Tesco.

10). Comment: What is happening to the (Royal British) Legion building?

Answer: Good question! Does anybody know? It might make an excellent sports/social facility. We'll try to find out for a later Link.

Lytchett Matravers Bus Service

t our February meeting we were told by our County Councillor, Fred Drane, that the current bus service provider, FIRST, would be stopping any service to Lytchett Matravers on 6th April, after that date a new service from Morebus would start on Monday 7th April.

We were very happy to hear that the village would continue to be served by any buses, but have been trying to get some more information from Morebus to be able to pass this onto the village. It also seems that the only bus for workers in Poole is going to be provided at 7am, with a last service back to the village at 5.25pm. We feel this is not sufficient for the village and are currently looking at other

service providers to add additional buses to the village. Morebus do have information on this new service on their website, but we have asked for leaflets to be available at the library and other outlets in the village.

Should we receive any updates in the next few weeks we shall put notices on the information board outside Tesco, and on our website.

We shall continue to do our best to ensure a full and useful bus service in the village and would encourage everyone to try and use it or we might lose it in the future as subsidies for these services are now being withdrawn at County Council level.
