What's in a Name?

History

When the Foxhills development was built by the Morrish Brothers in the 1980's certain arrangements were agreed for the maintenance of the common parts. Fifteen years later the Parish Council was handed a sum of money, which, if invested, would provide for the maintenance in perpetuity of the open space associated with the development.

The money initially earned enough bank interest but with historically low rates the Parrish Council has latterly had to make the 'dowry' work harder by taking out a bond. This currently covers the annual costs and some is reinvested to counteract the effects of inflation. A condition of the arrangement, under a 'Section 106 agreement' was a play park and this was completed in 2011 by a group of residents working with the parish council and grant providers, notably Viridor. A further condition was a footpath alongside the stream through to Deans Drove to provide a route to school for children and parents. With the

Neighbourhood Plan Update

he Neighbourhood Planning team has continued to meet to review the responses from the questionnaire and how to put those responses into formal structured plans. We have formed into three groups; land development, village amenities and school/traffic.

Purbeck District Council has advised the Neighbourhood Planning team that Lytchett Matravers is surrounded by green belt and only an amendment to the planning policy would allow any development. This would seem to be a safeguard against further expansion of the village. However, Purbeck District Council is also starting a review of their Local Plan, which governs local planning policy. The objective of this review is to allocate more housing developments across the district. As we know, Lytchett Matravers has been a favourite destination for such development in the past and it is vital that the Neighbourhood Planning team, the Parish Council and all residents take an active part in the review so that any development fits in with the wishes of the village expressed in the questionnaire responses.

The Neighbourhood Planning team has been looking at other potential sites and will include those sites in the Neighbourhood Plan as a guide. But the Neighbourhood Plan cannot set out any specific plans since that land is currently in the green belt.

The Neighbourhood Planning team has also opened preliminary discussions with Wessex Water on their plans for the reservoir site. Their initial proposal has been refused, but could

be approved in a modified form. Engaging with the local community is important for such a central site. Many responses to the questionnaire outlined the need for some smaller units that would be suitable for older residents to downsize to, thereby freeing up larger houses within the village for younger families. This is a critical aspect of the discussions with Wessex Water.

The school/traffic team has focused on several potential improvements and has circulated a specific additional questionnaire to parents of children at the village school. These include opening up an entrance from Eldons Drove to the school field for parents walking with their children, replacement of the bus shelter that blocks the pavement by the school crossing with a more open design that doesn't encroach on to the pavement, using the Lytchett Astro entrance as an overflow car park and installing parking controls (yellow lines) around the key road junctions near the school (Cecil Place, Eldons Drove, Deans Drove and Dillons Gardens).

The questionnaire responses suggested that in overall terms, we should try and make more use of the current village amenities, rather than build new ones.

We are still looking for more residents who are interested in taking part in the meetings and contributing to the final plan, so do contact anyone from the Parish Council and they will be able to advise where and when the next meeting will be.

Who Cuts the Grass In Lytchett Matravers?

he Parish Council receives a number of enquiries each year about the maintenance of areas of grass in and around the village. The answer is that public areas are maintained by a combination of agencies working in partnership. We hope the following helps to make things clearer.....

Roadside verges. These are maintained by Dorset County Council Highways department, and are divided into two categories:

1. Roadside grass verges within the village boundaries – which they term "urban". These are currently scheduled to receive 6 cuts per year between April and October. However, the cutting frequency is under review and may be reduced in the future.

2. Roadside verges on the back lanes and the roads connecting Lytchett Matravers with other communities. DCC Highways Dept refer to these as "rural", and aim to cut them twice between April and October.

DCC Highways Department's concern in cutting roadside verges is safety. Consequently their priority is to ensure an adequate level of visibility. Appearance of these areas is secondary to that.

The cost of this work is provided for within the County Council's proportion of the Council Tax. **Recreation Ground.** The Northern (major) part of the field is leased to the Sports Club. The Club employs a contractor to cut the

grass on the main sports field playing areas each month. Whilst attending to this, the same contractor also gang mows the Southern end of the recreation ground which has been retained by the Parish Council for children's play areas, the skate park, and an open area for general use.

Foxhills Development - Open space. This is done by a contractor who also does a lot of work for the District Council. The contractor was appointed by the Parish Council as a result of a competitive tender process. This ensures the community gets good value for this expenditure. The grass is maintained as a general open space, rather than cut short as a games playing surface.

Cemetery. This has been maintained by the same experienced specialist contractor for over 10 years. The contractor maintains a number of other cemeteries. Again, the appointment was the result of competitive tendering, and it provides the community with very good value for money.

Allotments trackways, Memorial Green, edges of the Recreation Ground, areas around the bus stops, edges of Lytchett Astro, and other small areas of grass around the village.

All of this is done for the Parish Council by a local contractor who lives in the village and who takes great care and pride in his work.

Chairmans' **Update**

We started a new four-year term in May without the benefit of some stalwarts who had made great contributions over the years before standing down.

We were tremendously fortunate that four new members stepped forward in June to take on the work of the Council. Over the time I've served I've notice that the work we do is more and more relevant to

the future of the village, we dispense larger sums of money and affect more parts of village life. I'm so pleased we have a full complement of councillors to dispatch these tasks.

The most far reaching is the Neighbourhood Planning process whereby some responsibilities for the District's Local Plan originate here in the village. We are looking into how much and where housing and business development should take place, what infrastructure will that require, and what any development should look like. subject matter experts from within the village to help with our deliberations.
